ORDER

Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, in WP (CrI.) No. -129/2006 titled as Laxmi Vs Union of India & Others has passed an order dated 18.07.2013 to regulate the sale of Acid (as per list enclosed) across the country and vide aforesaid order certain guidelines have been issued for compliance as per details below:-


1. Acid shall not be sold to any person below 18 years of age.
2. The Seller shall be personally accountable for the safe keeping of acid(s) in his/her premises.
3. The counter Sale of Acid is completely prohibited/banned unless the seller maintains proper records in this regard.
4. The Seller is required to maintain Log Book/Register recording the sale of Acid(s) which will contain the complete details of the persons to whom acid(s) is/are sold alongwith the quantity sold.
5. The Log Book/Register should also specify the reason/purpose of procuring the acid(s).
6. The sale will be made only when the buyer produces a photocopy of ID issued by the Government which also has the address of the person and proves that the holder is 18 years of age. Seller shall declare all stocks of acid in his/her possession to the concerned Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) every 15 days.

The Hon'ble Court has further directed that in respect of Educational Institutions Research Laboratories, Hospitals, Government Departments and the Departments of Public Sector Undertakings who require to keep and store acid for various purposes, shall follow the following norms/guidelines:-

- a. The agencies will nominate a person who shall be accountable for possession and safe custody of acid(s) in its premises;
- b. All such agencies shall maintain a register having details of acid (s) used.
- c. The said register(s) shall be filed with the concerned SDM periodically who has been authorized by the Hon'ble Court to check all violations,
- d. The acid(s) shall be stored under the supervision of the nominated person and there shall be compulsory checking of the students/personnel leaving the Laboratories/ place of storage where the acid is used.

In view of the above directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India which are to be implemented in letter and spirit, SHO, Police Station, 1 to 8, Delhi is hereby directed to provide the details of all Vendors/ Stockist in their respective jurisdiction involved in the sale of Acid(s) directly/indirectly as well as storage of the acid so that necessary action including confiscations of the stock, including penalty may be initiated for the violation of Hon'ble Court's Order.



List of Acid (poison) hazardous for life

C-17

1. Acetic acid (beyond 25% concentration by weight),
2. Acetic Anhydride, Sulphuric acid (H_2SO_4)(beyond 5% concentration by weight).
3. Hydrochloric acid (HCl) (beyond 5% concentration by weight).
4. Phosphoric acid (H_3PO_4).
5. Hydrofluoric acid (HF).
6. Perchloric acid ($HClO_4$).
7. Formic Acid (beyond 10% concentration by weight).
8. Hydrocyanic acid except substances containing less than 0.1 per cent weight in weight of Hydrocyanic acid.
9. Nitric acid, except substances containing less than 5 per cent weight in weight of Nitric Acid.
10. Oxalic Acid.
11. Perchloride of mercury (corrosive sublimate).
12. Hydrogen Peroxide (beyond 50% concentration by weight).
13. Formaldehyde (beyond 25% concentration by weight).
14. Phenol (beyond 3% concentration by weight).
15. Potassium Hydroxide except substances containing less than 2 per cent weight in weight of Potassium Hydroxide.
16. Sodium Hydroxide except substances containing less than 2 per cent weight in weight of sodium Hydroxide.
